## **Synopsis**

Guest v Guest [2022] UKSC 27 is now the leading authority in England and Wales on the appropriate remedial response to a successful plea of proprietary estoppel. Where a claimant had relied to their detriment on informal representations that they would be granted an interest in land, there had previously been considerable debate about whether the claimant should have their expectations fulfilled or generally be limited to having their detriment reversed. In Guest v Guest, a majority of the United Kingdom Supreme Court expressed a preference for the expectation-based approach, subject to some exceptions. While the decision can be regarded as settling the debate in England as a matter of positive law, the full implications of its approach are both unclear and controversial.

In this joint lecture, Dr Brian Sloan and Dr Jordan English will discuss the decision in *Guest v Guest* and its potential implications for Hong Kong law. The lecture will consider recent decisions on proprietary estoppel in Hong Kong case law (eg, *Ng Sew Hoi v Chong Yin Sing* [2024] HKCFI 414 and *So Kwai Chung v Wong Wai Ying Anita* [2025] HKCFA 8) and whether Hong Kong courts have adopted, and should adopt, the reasoning of the majority in *Guest v Guest*.

Brian is an academic member of the Property Litigation Association and an honorary academic member of the Property Bar Association in the UK. As well as being a Des Voeux Chambers-Hong Kong University Visiting Fellow in August-September 2025, he was previously a Visiting Fellow at City University of Hong Kong.

**Jordan English** is an Associate Professor of Law at the University of Oxford and a Tutor and Fellow in Law at Magdalen College. Jordan's research focuses on private law, with a particular emphasis on contract law and property law. He is the author of *Discharge* of Contractual Obligations (Oxford University Press, 2025), which has recently been shortlisted for the SLS Peter Birks Prize for Outstanding Early Career Scholarship, and the co-author of the *The Law of* <u>Tracing</u> (Federation Press, 2021). His research has been cited widely, including by the High Court of Australia, the New South Wales Court of Appeal, the Full Court of the Federal Court of Australia, the England and Wales High Court (Commercial Court), and the Grand Court of the Cayman Islands.
